

SEX OFFENDER DISCLOSURE AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT FORM

(For use of this form see CAMReg 190-6, The Proponent of this form is the Provost Marshal)

I, (print name) _____, have read and understand the policy. By signing this document, I certify under a penalty of perjury that neither I nor any person living in my household is a registered sex offender or required to register as a sex offender. I understand I am required to notify the Installation Provost Marshall's Office immediately if circumstances change so that this certification is no longer true. I understand the policies, procedures, and consequences below apply to those persons who will reside with me.

POLICIES

CAM Regulation 190-6 requires that all convicted sex offenders coming onto post must register at the Installation Provost Marshall's Office, where a information report DA Form 3975 will be generated annotating their compliance with state and federal guidance.

When such notification is made to the Installation Provost Marshal/Chief of Police, the IPMO will prepare a Bar to the Installation packet and submit through the appropriate agencies (Directorate of Emergency Services, OSJA, etc.) to the Garrison Commander.

The Garrison Commander will review the facts and make a final determination. Individuals barred from the installation will not be authorized to live in on-post housing.

PROCEDURES

Applicants who cannot sign this form because they or a dependent who will reside in the home with them are a registered sex offender will be required to submit written information and documentation, which may include but not limited to the following, in order to be considered eligible for housing by the Installation Commander:

1. Whether the sex offender is the military member, civilian, or dependent.
2. Nature and circumstances of the offense.
3. Exact criminal statute or law under which the person was convicted.
4. State or jurisdiction where the offense occurred and was adjudicated.
5. Elapsed time since the offense was committed.
6. Age of the offender at the time the offense was committed.
7. Age of the victim at the time the offense was committed.
8. Evidence that tends to demonstrate offender's rehabilitation, exemplary conduct, or other commitment to obeying the law.
9. Whether the conviction requiring registration has been reversed, vacated, or set aside, or if the registrant has been granted unconditional pardon of innocence for the offense requiring registration.
10. Conditions of parole/probation, or monitoring, if any.

CONSEQUENCES

I fully understand that making false official statements is punishable under Article 107 of the UCMJ. The maximum punishment is confinement for 5 years, total forfeiture of pay and allowances, and a dishonorable discharge.
